

Governor Pen Portraits

Rachel Riddell: Chair of Governors

Rachel gained a BSc Hons from Aston University, specialising in Accountancy and Marketing. Her early career was with the Distributive and Knitting, Lace and Net Industry Training Boards, ahead of moving into manufacturing industry. She has held Director of HR roles, in the textile sector, working for large suppliers to Marks and Spencer, with strong operational interest, including responsibility for a manufacturing plant. Her last role before retiring to North Yorkshire was as Director of Human Resources for Nottingham Trent University. Rachel brings significant expertise in human resource management, continuing professional development, leadership and change management. She has a son and daughter who are now grown up; both of whom attended Newcastle University gaining degrees in Chemical Engineering and Architecture. She has chaired the Personnel Committee, and led the board for the last two years.

Matt Graham: Parent Governor

Matt grew up in St Albans before reading Natural Sciences (Physics) at Selwyn College, Cambridge. After Cambridge he went to the Royal Military Academy Sandhurst and was commissioned into the Royal Signals. He spent 16 years in the army, serving on operations in Northern Ireland, Bosnia and Afghanistan, as well as tours at the Defence Procurement Agency and the Ministry of Defence. He attended the Joint Services Command and Staff College and gained an MA in Defence Studies from King's College London. In his final tour he was based in York with 2 Signal Regiment and spent 8 months in Kandahar leading his squadron providing communications for NATO forces throughout southern Afghanistan. Matt left the army in 2008 to join UBS Investment Bank, but after a year in the South East the pull of Yorkshire proved too great.

The family returned to York in early 2010 and Matt joined the NHS, initially working for South Tees Hospitals NHS Foundation Trust in Middlesbrough. More recently he was Strategy Director for a large teaching hospital in Manchester and he now leads a joint programme between the six acute hospital trusts in West Yorkshire. Matt has a daughter in Year 8 and two children in primary school.

Ruth Hatton: Parent Governor

Ruth attended Malton School before gaining a BSc Honours degree in Mathematics from the University of Warwick. She worked as an Engineering Specialist, undertaking research and development projects at BAE Systems. She was responsible for managing collaborative research programmes, working with a number of UK companies and universities. She was awarded Chartered Engineer and European Engineer status and achieved membership of the Royal Aeronautical Society. In 2001 Ruth and her family moved to The Netherlands where they experienced living as part of an international community, meeting other families from all over the world. Ruth returned to Malton in 2007. She became a Governor at Malton Community Primary School in 2008 and has been a Governor at Malton School since 2010. She has chaired a number of committees and currently sits on the Accountability and Student matters committees. Ruth is also a leader with 1st Malton Guides. Ruth has two sons, one at Malton School and the other at York University.

Rod Anson: Invited Governor, Vice Chair, Chair of Finance & Premises Committee

Rod grew up in Scotland and the West Country before gaining a BSc Eng Hons degree from Aberdeen University in Engineering. His early career took him from technical manufacturing, through to product development and marketing of textiles for Courtaulds in Nottingham. After gaining an MBA Masters degree at the Strathclyde Graduate Business School he followed a passion and moved to Yorkshire, developing international business for Sara Lee Bakery and marketing the UK's favourite dessert. Rod then brought big business experience to a local farm diversification project creating a new business strategy, developing its marketing and operations
