He was selected as an Exchange Officer with the Australian Army and served as an Instructor at the School of Infantry. He was selected to be a student at the Army Command and Staff College. His senior appointments included Brigade Major Household Division, responsible for the planning, co-ordination and supervision of all State Ceremonial events in London, including the Queen's Birthday Parade, State Opening of Parliament and State Visits. He was appointed Commandant Military Corrective Training Centre Colchester, Commander of the only custodial establishment currently operating within the British Armed Forces, providing facilities for detaining and retraining servicemen and women of all 3 Service and was appointed Governor of HM YOI Colchester, a trial set up by the Home Secretary to test whether a military regime could reduce the rate of re-offending among civilian young offenders. He acted as NATO KFOR (Kosovo Force) Liaison Officer to Lieutenant General Agim Çeku, Commander Kosovo Protection Corps and subsequently Prime Minister of Kosovo. His final tour in the Army was as Commander Defence Training Estates North, effectively Chief Executive of one of the Ministry of Defence's largest training estates within the UK based in Catterick, which introduced him to the delights of North Yorkshire, where he has chosen to retire. His final 10 years before retirement were spent as a GP Practice Manager in South Wales and Northamptonshire. He successfully managed his GP Practice during the Covid 19 pandemic, including the implementation of NHS contingency plans, at the same time as building an extension to the GP surgery.
